PAUL VALRIE, PGK
February 29, 1936 – September 6, 2008

On September 6, 2008, Council 6028 lost one of their own. Paul Valrie, Jr., who served as Grand Knight from 2006-2007, lost his battle with multiple myeloma.

Paul was born in Amelia, Texas on February 29, 1936. He was the older of two boys, born to Paul and Josephine Valrie. He attended Compton High School where he excelled in academics and track. After receiving an honorable discharge from the Army, he attended San Jose State University where he majored in engineering.

He married Arthel Jewella Jones on July 10, 1966 and had two children; daughter Stacie Eileen born on September 4, 1968 and son Stephen Paul born on June 29, 1971. Paul had a successful career as an Electrical Engineer, working at such companies as McDonnell Douglas and Hughes Aircraft.

Paul joined the Knights of Columbus on August 1, 1968. He was a member of the first recruitment class and was instrumental in the early formation of our Council. Brother Oscar Najera recalls Paul being "so quiet at times but when he spoke we all listened to what he had to say."

Up until his death, Paul was dedicated to the Knights of Columbus. Brother Paul Coble describes him best when he said that he "was always there when you needed him. He just appeared at the event and did what needed doing."

Working his way up the chairs, he became Grand Knight in July 2006 – a position he truly desired. Although plagued by sickness Paul made a fine Grand Knight and continued to serve as a mentor for those that came after. As Brother Joseph 'Buddy' Sofka stated "Paul paved the road for me when I became Grand Knight, he showed me what to do and kept me in line which made my year so much easier and joyful."

On September 13, 2008, Paul was laid to rest at Rose Hills Memorial Park; sent off by a Color Corp of Knights from the Father Felix J. Pena Assembly and 3rd Degree Members from Council 6028. Paul was a wonderful father, role model, Brother Knight and friend. He honorably served God through his Church, the Knights of Columbus, and his daily life activities. He will be deeply missed by those who have come to know and love him. May eternal rest be granted onto you Brother Paul by our Lord Jesus Christ until we meet again.

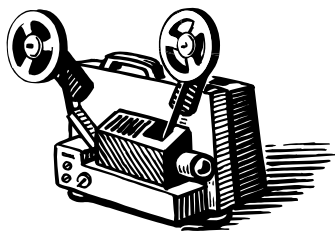
1ST SATURDAY ROSARY FOR PEACE

STATEMENT ON FINANCIAL SERVICES COMPANY AND THE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS



The upheaval in the financial markets in recent days has caused a great deal of concern virtually everywhere, among financial services professionals, regulators and consumers alike. Our "liquidity is viewed as extremely strong, reflecting an asset portfolio that consists primarily of high-quality, investment grade bonds." S&P also stated that our "investment portfolio has very strong credit quality" and our capital adequacy is "among the strongest in the industry." That remains the case today. Our capitalization is, and remains, "extremely strong."

Our surplus stood at more than \$1.7 billion on June 30th of this year, providing an unusually large cushion of protection against turmoil of the sort we have seen in recent weeks.

One crucial area sets us completely apart from firms like AIG, which had incurred enormous debt. We have no debt at all.

As a result, our financial condition remains extremely strong, and you can be certain that you are fully protected by one of the strongest and most reliable insurance programs in the entire industry.

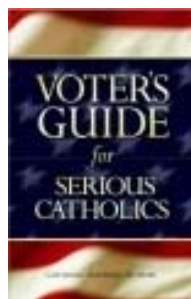

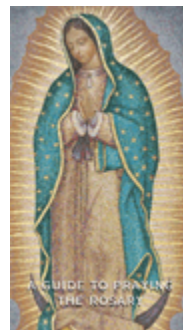

Do You Know the Origin of the word "Mass"

The Eucharistic Liturgy began to be known as the Mass by the end of the second century. This tradition gained ground quickly in the West as a result of the Latin phrase said at the end of the Liturgy: "*Ite, Missa est,*" which means: "Go, you are

[or "it is"] sent." That concluding statement by the priest conveyed the missionary character of the participants in the Mass echoing the words of the Lord as he was about to ascend into heaven from the Mount of Olives. Here, Christ was officially sending the Church forth on its mission of bringing the Gospel to all the world: "Go [Latin: *ite*], therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. 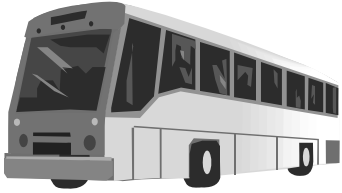
