KNIGHTS CALLED TO TRANSFORM WORLD THROUGH CHARITY, UNITY AND FRATERNITY



In his annual report to the 126th Supreme Convention, Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson said Knights of Columbus must cooperate with Pope Benedict XVI and be “co-workers in the renewal” of the Church and the world. “We have the power given us by the Holy Spirit to transform the world and ‘Build a Civilization of Love through Charity, Unity and Fraternity.’”

Supreme Knight Anderson told Knights that “defending life and defending marriage constitute two of our most urgent tasks.” He called the defense of marriage an “issue of the greatest importance.” Noting that 2008 is an election year in the United States, Anderson said that the Order would remain nonpartisan.

However, he continued, it is time Catholics “stop creating excuses for voting for pro-abortion politicians.” We will never succeed in building a culture of life if we continue to vote for politicians who support a culture of death” he said. The great challenges that face the Order in the future are “great opportunities” which can be met with assistance from the Holy Spirit. ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

On September 4th and October 2nd there will be the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament beginning at 6:00p.m. until 10:00 p.m.

Recently, Brother Knights have expressed interest in returning to all night adoration, where Knights would stand watch faithfully until the next group of Knights arrives to fill in. If the Pope himself would give you a special invitation to visit him in the Vatican, this honor would be nothing in comparison to the honor and dignity that Jesus Himself bestows upon you with the Invitation of spending one hour with Him in the Blessed Sacrament. Yet so many Catholics and Brother Knights are unable to find time to spend 15 minutes, 30 minutes or 1 hour in adoration.

If Jesus were actually visible in church, everyone would run to welcome Him, but He remains hidden in the Sacred Host under the appearance of Bread, because He is calling us to faith so that we may come to Him in humility. Jesus wants us to do more than to go to mass on Sunday. As Pope John Paul II stated "Our communal worship at Mass must go together with

our personal worship of Jesus in Eucharistic adoration in order that our love may be complete."

The benefits of Eucharistic Adoration are great. Not only do you grow spiritually with each moment you spend with Jesus, but just as you can't be exposed to the sun without receiving its rays, neither can you come to Jesus exposed in the Blessed Sacrament without receiving the Divine Rays of His Grace, His Love, His Peace.

You may sign up to be an "adore" which allows you to schedule yourself for 1 hour during the next adoration. Signing up is your commitment that you will spend time with Jesus reciting your favorite prayers, reading the bible, praying a rosary or doing whatever type of prayerful devotion that suits you before Our Lord. You can just sit and say nothing simply keeping Him company, just as you would with a dear friend.

Anderson. "In a special way, we remember the brave men and women of the military who work tirelessly, even to the point of sacrificing their own lives, to bring about true peace rooted in justice," he added.

INSURANCE CORNER

September is Life Insurance Awareness Month. To help educate consumers about the need for and value of adequate life insurance protection, the Life Insurance Market Research Association (LIMRA) has published the following five facts. These statistics are certainly worth considering.

Fact 1: Nearly three-fourths of North Americans agree that life insurance is the best way to protect against premature death of the primary wage earner.

Fact 2: Twenty-four million households have no life insurance protection at all. Almost one third of adults have no life insurance protection.

Fact 3: Forty-four percent of all households either don't own life insurance and believe they should, or own life insurance and believe they need more. Among those that already own some life insurance, 40 percent believe they don't have enough.

Fact 4: One-fourth of primary wage earners feel they do not have a plan in place to provide a decent standard of living for their family if they died tomorrow. Twelve percent of families would immediately have trouble meeting everyday living expenses and another 15 percent would have difficulty keeping up after several months.

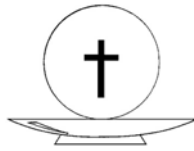
Fact 5: People would like to discuss life insurance with a qualified professional agent. They believe that buying life insurance is an important and complex financial decision. Half find it difficult to decide how much to buy, and 43 percent worry about making the wrong decision.

REMINDERS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS



DID YOU KNOW?

Do you know why the Priest elevates the host at mass? The practice (tradition) of the priest elevating the sacred host began in Paris, France, in the year 1210 by direction of the archbishop there. He was concerned that there could be confusion among the faithful about when the Eucharistic elements were transubstantiated from bread and wine into the Body and Blood as well as soul and divinity of the Lord. The potential for confusion stemmed from the fact that prior to this modification, the priest, who was facing toward the altar and away from the congregation, held the sacred host in front of him, which meant the congregation, behind him was unable to see the host during the consecration. The archbishop wanted to ensure that the faithful adored Christ in the Eucharist once the consecration had taken place, and not before (which would have constituted the material sin of idolatry, for worshipping bread). The tradition of elevating the host (and chalice) at the consecration quickly became popular and spread rapidly to the Western Church as a whole. *Taken from "Why is that in Tradition? 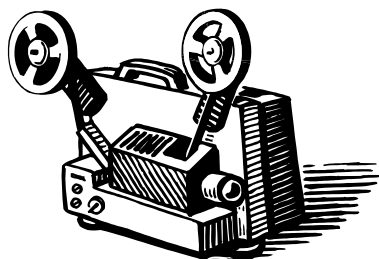
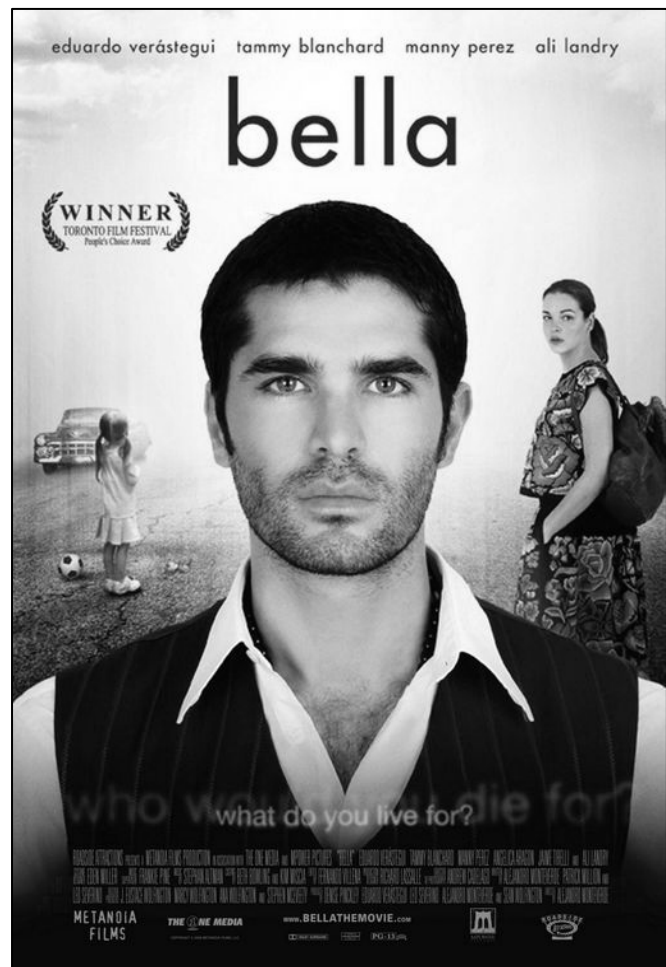
